A Note From The SCS Office

With the success of our first week of transition to kindergarten in-person learning, we will be accelerating the projected timeline for additional grades. As long as counties continue to meet the advisory metrics, we plan to phase in multiple grades a week, beginning with 2nd and 3rd grade on March 15th. You can see our updated anticipated roll out in the calendar to the right. As grades are phased in, we will announce cohort assignments (either Hybrid Cohort A, B, or C (CDL only)). This information will be emailed to families by grade at least a week in advance. Cohort assignments are based on learning model preferences indicated on the Hybrid Transition Survey.

If your student is in Hybrid Cohort A or B (returning to in-person hybrid learning), for each day your student attends on campus you should:

1. Complete the [Student Entry Screening Form](#) by 7:15 am on the day of attendance.
2. Have your car line hanger on your rearview mirror for both pick-up/drop-off. Hangers were distributed in the beginning of the year, please let the office know if you do not have one.
3. Arrive on time for morning drop-off (7:45-8:00 am) and pick-up (11:45 am-12:00 pm). Students should be dropped-off/picked-up in their assigned car line zone (see the car line slide for more information). Please do not pass cars at any point during car line.

For students remaining in CDL, the new schedule will be communicated by your student's teacher (a brief overview is available on the CDL At Home slide). This new schedule will start the week your student's grade transitions (for example, 1st grade will start their new CDL schedule on March 8). If you have questions about the new schedule, please contact your student's teacher.

CAR LINE OVERVIEW

- Masks are required while on campus.
- Students assigned to drop off/pick-up zones ([see the map here](#)), with car line running the same route for both morning and afternoon.
- Car line number hangers required for morning and afternoon car line.
- Walkers should check in at the main building overhang.
- Students screened and checked in before exiting car.
- It is important to arrive on time for drop off and pick up.
- Sanitizing stations set up for use when entering/exiting classrooms.

CLASSROOM


CLASSROOM OVERVIEW

- Masks must be worn on campus.
- Students remain 6 feet away at all times.
- Students use personal supplies only, no group sharing.
- Students assigned individual spots in classroom, with elementary rotating between tables and lap desks.
- Classes divided into 2 cohorts for in-person learning.

- SAFETY PROTOCOLS**
- All students will be required to wear masks on campus. There will be designated mask break areas for students who need a short mask break.
 - Students will remain 6 feet away at all times from other students/staff, with a minimum of 35 square feet per person maintained in all classrooms.
 - All students will be screened before entering school. If they are ill, show COVID-19 symptoms, or unable to pass the entry screening (see car line slide for the full screening questions list), student will not be allowed to enter.
 - If a student gets ill during school, they will be quarantined and parents will be contacted to pick up their student.
 - All areas and items will be sanitized throughout the school day, and deep cleaned between cohorts.

Why are in-school days half days and only 2 days a week?

In order to accommodate both in-person learning and CDL learning, students in cohort A and B will only have in-person learning for half a day, 2 days a week. This allows the teacher to still connect live with any students doing CDL in the afternoon as well as limits the cohort size so that SCS can comply with the required space guidelines in the Ready School's Safe Learners guidance. Half day schedules also allow for students to have lunch at home. Due to spacing limitations we currently aren't able to accommodate lunches on campus and meet ODE requirements.

Can you switch from hybrid to CDL or from CDL to hybrid?

With the understanding that consistency is key for student learning we would like to discourage families from switching learning models (Hybrid to CDL or CDL to Hybrid) for the school year. However, we understand that families may encounter unique circumstances when a change to a learning model may be necessary. Requests to change learning models must be made by submitting a letter with reason for request to the school office for consideration by the school administration. If you do transition from CDL to hybrid, please keep in mind that a preference for either cohort A or cohort B may not be accommodated based on current cohort sizes. Switches between cohort A and cohort B will also not be accommodated due to COVID-19 tracing requirements required by the ODE.

Are uniforms required for in-person learning?

Yes, students should be in uniform while on campus. You can find the uniform policy on our website [here](#).

Are masks required and what type need to be worn?

All students are required to wear a mask on campus. This includes time spent in the classroom as well as when outdoors for recess and breaks. Masks do not need to be in uniform colors but must be school appropriate. No gators, and face shields alone will not be allowed unless specified by a medical professional.

What will CDL learning look like during the hybrid model?

CDL learning will look different from what has been done throughout the school year. Students will have their same teacher, who will post recorded videos and assignments in the online classroom each day. Students will then complete all assignments on their own during the morning. In the afternoons, there will be live check ins with the teacher, office hours as well as time for specials and electives. See more information on the CDL At Home slide.

What if a student is sick?

All sick students (including those with COVID-19 symptoms or those who are otherwise ill) will be required to stay home. For a more detailed overview, please see the Health and Safety slide in this document.

If a child is tested for COVID-19, will SCS inform the family of the result?

If a child is tested for COVID-19 at SCS, whether the result is negative or positive, the family will be notified with a phone call and also a letter with results when the student is picked up.

Is signing the consent form for the on-site antigen test required for hybrid attendance? Can I have testing done through our provider or is on-site testing and consent expected/required?

Signing the consent form (found on the Health and Safety slide) for on site COVID-19 testing is not required for hybrid attendance. On site testing is not expected or required. You can take your child to your provider for COVID-19 testing.
