Administrator Report: Joy Raboli (Principal)

Enrollment is steady at 222. Results from our assessment from last year has us ranked well in Oregon. We had a couple areas in our testing with a couple cohorts that are not the same as the district level. It was really about comparing 300 students in the district to a class of 19 from our school. One factor: a couple cohorts have higher levels of IEPs and 504's, also attendance has a negative effect, I think covid era attendance is still at play here. We are going to look at how to

close that gap. More mid assessment progress done. Again it's hard to compare scores to the district number because we are only looking at 19 kids where the district is looking at hundreds. We are inching up, especially looking at statewide scores. We are orange where the district is gray. We are still held back by covid.

Yesterday I hand delivered the annual report to the district and presented to them the audit.

Integrated Programs quarter 4 annual progress report: Expenditures and progress markers


We have 2 ways to spend this money. First we pay for one of our full time aids and the other is to pay for our full time counselor.

Ms. Ellis, the counselor, was only working ¾ time before covid and since covid we have been able to hire her on a full time basis to help with the mental health of our students. The discussion included how Ms. Ellis is used to help the students on a one on one and in the classrooms to help all the students learn how to deal with anxiety and other mental health issues. Our aid has helped to increase safety on the playground, small group and literacy instruction, and assistance in the classrooms.

We continue to see remarkable improvements in our students' experiences due to the support of a full-time aide. With an additional staff member, we've enhanced safety at recess, ensuring better supervision and a more secure environment for all students. The aide has also played a pivotal role in facilitating small group learning, allowing for more individualized attention and tailored instruction. As a result, we are seeing measurable gains in student achievement. This support has been critical in addressing both the academic and safety needs of our growing student community.

One key learning has been the increasing demand for staff time to support two students with Type 1 Diabetes. This requires at least one hour of office time per student each day for monitoring, injections, recording data, and communications. To address this, we hired a part-time school nurse to train, delegate, and supervise our office staff. The nurse also works with several schools facing a growing number of Diabetes cases, which may be a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic. This additional need underscores the importance of having adequate support staff to meet the diverse needs of our student population.

I went to outdoor school and visited the 5th grade, it was a great time. I'm visiting all the classrooms and giving them

Hadar is actually taking a class on specifically school gardens. The wreath fundraiser is happening right now. Korrin is helping with sweatshirts. We are also doing a pumpkin carving contest and the candy monster is coming back this month for candy donations. We will have a few meetings later in the year with new parents to educate and brainstorm what the PAC is and what it will become. These meetings will be in addition to the regular PAC meetings.

Treasurer: Korrin Fyall (Treasurer)

On the 8th we had our executive meeting to decide what to do with the maturing CDs. We kept them in 5 cds, 1 with what we have earned in interest. We will keep rolling the interest in a 9 month CD so it's accessible. The bank worked with us to get great interest rates, 4.55 for 2 CDs, a 3 and a 5 month, and 3, 9 month Cd's at 4.35. We got reimbursed for outdoor school, so that was great. Pleased with how the fun run went. Other than that we don't have much more but we are doing good financially.
